## What are Māori Data?



#### Data from Māori (self-generated)

From Māori organisations and businesses

#### Data about Māori (generated by others)

Used to describe or compare Māori collectives

### Data about Māori resources (generated by self and/or others)

Emerges from research on Māori resources

#### Māori Data Sovereignty




is a key mechanism for enabling **self-determination** and innovation

is concerned with

- protecting lwi/Māori rights of access to data
- participation in data integration activities
- partnership in the governance and/or ownership of data
- supports the realisation of Māori and Iwi aspirations
- recognises that Māori data should be subject to Māori governance

## Is the right of Māori to access, to use, to have governance and control over Māori Data

#### 1. Data for Governance

Access and Use to transform the lives of Māori

#### 2. Governance of Data

Governance and Control to ensure the data is relevant and responsive

## Data from a Māori worldview: Whakapapa




- Where it comes from and where it is going to (past, present, future)
- Relates to the purpose and use of data
- Relates to the importance of contextual knowledge
- Relationships within the data (linking individuals to groups)
- Whakapapa of the data (metadata, provenance)
- Still exists even if data set is anonymised or de-identified
- Whanaungatanga
  - Data relates to both the individual and the collective
  - Collective identifiy is integral to Māori data

## Data from a Māori worldview: Taonga




- All data are taonga
  - Intrinsic mana inherent value of data (all data are taonga)
  - Extrinsic mana valued for specific purposes (taonga is as taonga is used)
- Ensure the mana and mauri of the taonga are intact
  - Clear expectations around how the data should be treated
  - Separation of data from source
- Taonga are tapu / data need to be managed
  - How do we define data that are tapu?
  - Kaitiakitanga through Kawa/tikanga
  - Consistent with Manaakitanga, wairuatanga
  - Tikanga around data for specific purposes

## Data from a Māori worldview: Rights & Interests




- Te Tiriti o Waitangi is a key context
- Rangatiratanga Rights in relation to data
  - · How rights can be defined, ownership vs use
  - · Iwi rights to access data when iwi affiliation is known
  - · Data sharing for wellbeing of collective vs individual consent
  - Defining group vs individual rights in the context of data
- Mana Motuhake control Māori can have over Māori data
  - What should we collect independent of Govt
  - Who decides who gets to use data
- Kawanatanga governance of data
  - What Māori data should Govt agencies be able to use
  - Māori governance oversight body for Govt data
- Kaitiakitanga
  - How to keep government use of data in check
  - Govt responsibility to Māori data in terms of collection, use and storage
  - Can we work with data in private companies







- Tikanga and kawa at forefront




